

Harvard Papers in Botany Article Proposal Guidelines

Harvard Papers in Botany is an invite-only journal. All manuscript submissions will need to be proposed to the Editorial Board by potential authors to ensure they fit the scope and timeline of the journal.

Proposals for Harvard Paper in Botany should be sent directly to the Managing Editor (papers@oeb.harvard.edu) and include “HPB PROPOSAL” in the title of the email.

All proposals should include:

- Title of your proposed article
- Author list and affiliations. If the author list is longer than 5 names, please briefly identify the intellectual contributions of each team member. The editorial board encourages authors to consider all aspects of diversity in how authors are identified and listed.
- Identify a subject editor from the [editorial board](#) that you feel will best be able to understand the novelty of your manuscript.
- If the article will be written in English or Spanish.

For **research articles**, please provide 200-300 words detailing the novelty and importance of your findings as well as how your study fits into the scope of Harvard Papers in Botany.

For **monographs and syntheses**, please provide a 300-500 word summary of what will be covered in the submission and why a long-format monograph is necessary for the topic. You may provide up to 5-10 key references

For **book reviews**, please provide 200-300 words identifying the book being reviewed and a summary outlining why this specific book review would be of interest to audiences.

For **field notes and short communications**, authors can include a 200-300 word summary of the manuscript. If possible, please attach a completed draft of the notes/communication

For **biographies and resolutions of respect**, please provide a 200-300 word summary of who you will be profiling and why it is important to the community to profile them. Please confirm if you have been in contact with the individual regarding any biographies.

For **time-sensitive material**, please identify why the submission needs to be included in the next publication of Harvard Papers in Botany. Add “Time Sensitive” next to your title in the submission.
